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running this committee, then, I see.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No, but if you ask them, they'll tell you not because we're not on very good terms with them right now.

SENATOR ROBAK: Well...we set policy. They don't. But if they already have the authority to suspend a license, to have that suspension authority, then why don't they do it?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Because...

SENATOR ROBAK: Because of the hardship, I know. We went over that again. And what constitutes a hardship. If they can do it, let them do it. They're laying the burden on us when they have the ability to do it already.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schellpeper, were you going to answer her?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I didn't hear the question. Otherwise, I sure would have. (Laughter.)

SENATOR ROBAK: It wasn't a question. I guess it was a statement. If they have the ability to do a suspension, they're laying the burden on us, with this Legislature, because they can already suspend.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well...

SENATOR ROBAK: So they don't need us to do this for them...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They...

SENATOR ROBAK: ...when they already have a...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They can suspend...

SENATOR ROBAK: ...suspension ability.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Senator, they can suspend in serious violations. Minor violations the owner has the option, and they always take the option of the \$50. So...
