fact, even less than that. And where the court says what we're doing is we're building is a delay on the 99 percent of the cases for this step that nobody is making use of. It got out of the Business and Labor Committee. Then there was a question about whether or not the parties who'd originally been in the workers' comp negotiations had signed off on it. We took it out on, I think it was on General File, and it's now on Final Reading. The parties have met with the court, the court's explained its reasoning. All parties of the original workers' compensation compromise have agreed putting this item back into LB 128, and they have additionally agreed to meet in October, before the coming session, to put on the table any changes that they want to make to the work comp law, so that they can continue to try to work with each other, and if necessary, update the compromise to allow for changes, rather than trying to freeze into permanency the provisions of the work comp compromise. And so since dialogue has begun and since this provision is now acceptable to all parties, I ask that it be returned into LB 128. The net effect is to strike that provision of the workers' comp law that says agreed to IMEs have their findings accepted without challenge. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Is there any discussion on the motion to return to Select File? Seeing none, Senator Landis, do you wish to close? Closing is waived. The question before you is the motion to return LB 128 to Select File. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 128 is returned to Select File. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I would move the adoption of the aforementioned amendment. Thank you.
