SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, I don't know if you remember this bill, that was the equine bill and we had a lot of discussion on this bill, but what we really wanted to change here this morning is just a minor change. We had it an inch in the size of the warning sign, and there is a lot of discussion on it, and Senator Chambers and myself decided that was too small, and we went up to four inches on it, and then we had some horse people brought in a sign that made it at three inches, and we both agreed three inches was plenty big enough. So we are going to go from four inches back down to three inches. So that's all it does. So with that, well, I thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The motion is to return the bill to Select File. Senator Chambers, on the motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, you might imagine in the culture corner, there are a lot of quips and nonsensical remarks being made, but what Senator Jones is talking about is the lettering on the signs that notify people about the absence of liability under certain circumstances. He did have a sign in his office, which was lettered with three inch letters, and it's plenty large enough. People will be able to read it, and with the additional language that we had put in which made it clear that the sign had to be posted where it's likely a person will see it, I think this is a very reasonable amendment. I do support it.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Jones, did you wish to say anything in closing on your motion to return? The motion before the body is to return LB 153 to Select File for the purposes of a specific amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk.
