SPEAKER WITHEM: Question before the body is, shall the house be brought under call? All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 2 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. All members absent please return. Unauthorized parties leave the floor. The house is under call. There has been a request for a roll vote when all members return. House is under call. Members, please return to the Chamber. Senator Bruning, Senator Chambers, Senator Schrock, Senator Jones, Senator Kristensen. Senator Landis, could you please check in. Senator Chambers and Kristensen, you're wanted on the floor. Senator Robak, we've heard Senator Chambers has left the building. And a roll call vote has been requested. The question before the body now is, shall LB ...or shall...yeah, shall LB 249 be bracketed until April 30, 1998? Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1147 of the Legislative Journal.) 3 ayes, 33 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bracket motion is not agreed to. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk, I understand we have an amendment to the amendment.

CLERK: Senator Dwite Pedersen would move to amend. (See FA104 on page 1148 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Pedersen, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR DW. PEDERSEN: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, my amendment does a simple little thing of moving one number. Instead of having two times in four years, this moves it to two times in three years, makes it a little bit more palatable. And I think we'll gain a couple more votes for the bill. And I haven't got a chance to talk with everybody on it, but it's something that I wanted to run by the body. I talked to a couple people that are interested in the bill and said they would have no problem with it. If there's any questions, I'd be glad to try and answer them for you.
