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mean, just to buy a handgun?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's just to buy a handgun.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. Now if, all right, the way the law is now then, I can take...I can take, if I get this handgun, I wait five days, I get this handgun and say I'm out trapping some of Senator Jones' coons or something and I go and it's cold. You know, the most humane thing, I guess, if you trap an animal is to shoot it; I've got this pistol strapped on my or in my pocket, and my coat, I've got a long coat and that coat is down over, down over that pistol, is that legal?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No, it would be concealed.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Then it is a concealed weapon, is that right?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Um-hmm.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Have you ever...have you ever done that? You know, I suppose you could take your coat off and freeze to death, probably be very cold, so you would be in violation, then, of the law, if you had that jacket over the...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: If it's being concealed, if they can't see it. I think we talked about that earlier.

SENATOR JANSSEN: What...oh, I must have (inaudible), we had a meeting over here, but, all right, what about a police officer that has a coat that comes down over the top of this?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They can carry a weapon, police officers.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Even if it's concealed over...underneath that coat?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. Well, thanks. I had some questions answered. I appreciate that.
