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SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, being serious about this, Senator Robinson, they would...I, myself, would not apply for one of these handgun permits if I didn't have a reason, such as if I wasn't...if I was carrying a large amount of money, if my job took me places where I wouldn't usually go and I felt as though that...

SENATOR ROBINSON: What do you mean by that?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh, in strange areas where...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Oh, you mean when you go on a trip?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, no. No, no.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, but that's what you're saying.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I go on trips. I never take a gun.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, let's say if I was going to go deliver some merchandise to a particular place within a city that was notorious for holdups or things of that nature, where I felt as though that my...that the money or merchandise that I was carrying could be in jeopardy.

SENATOR ROBINSON: And get those T-bone steaks from you, huh?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yeah. There are times, Senator Robinson, they're very valuable.

SENATOR ROBINSON: You are telling me that you're an amateur carrying a handgun.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I don't think I would be an amateur after I took the training that is imposed upon you to carry one of these weapons.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Uh-huh. How much...people that carry handguns, how much do they use handguns? The only place you can really legally use them is out in a target shooting area, isn't
