CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the Select File amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment is adopted. Senator Bromm, do you wish to advance the bill? Senator Bromm, would you like to move to advance the bill?

SENATOR BROMM: I would so move, Madam Chairman.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion before you is the advancement of LB 466 to E & R for engrossing. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed say nay. LB 466 advances. We now turn to legislative resolutions. Legislative Resolutions 99, 100, 102, 103, and 105.
