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of constitutional amendments that came from the Constitutional Revision Commission, that will have this amendment offered to them, and that is the reason that they are on the ballot. There was some concerns, and I thought legitimate criticism that if we put an abnormally large number of constitutional amendments before the voters, at the general election of 1998, we may result in some confusion, and I don't know how much there is. I know Senator Kristensen doesn't believe there's maybe quite as big an issue as some people thought it was. But, in an attempt to deal with that issue, we're trying to divide these up so that these particular...this particular set of amendments can go before the public in the...the spring election in 1998. I would point out that LR 5CA, just to make sure that Senator Stuhr is clear and everybody else is clear, that is a measure that did not come from the Constitutional Revision Commission, that is a measure that Senator Stuhr brought forward. We spent a lot of time debating that on General File this year, made a major policy change amendment to that. It was advanced on, and it has also been pending on Select File for quite some time. When we get to LR 5CA we are not suggesting, I don't think Senator Kristensen and I are suggesting any particular course of action relative to that measure. That measure is also on the ballot today...on the agenda today to be considered, and that will be up to Senator Stuhr and the proponents of that bill, how that particular measure is handled. At this time though I would urge you to support the amendment to bring LR 32CA back from Final Reading to add this amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Withem. Your light is next, did you have anything else? Thank you. Senator Schimek, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I just rise to say that I support, not only the amendment, but the philosophy behind the amendment. And I would encourage you to return the bill to Select File.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, I'd like to ask Senator Kristensen a question, please.
