the body chooses to take them out, I'm not going to pull the bill or anything like that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, thank you. Senator Kristensen, this is not a question to you, but I object to this provision so much that I'll stay on this bill until we decide to adjourn today, and I'm going to tell you all why. I am very sensitive about the way the federal government does. I'm not like Timothy McVeigh and those kind of people as far as what I'm likely to do to show my opposition to them. I'm going to use whatever resources are available to me, legitimately, as a member of the Legislature. The FBI had tried to get the authority to function as law enforcement agents in Nebraska, be given certain types of immunity, and I stopped that bill from coming out of the Judiciary Committee. If they would offer it again, that would force me to go back and battle it. But I consider Waco, I consider Ruby Ridge, I consider Pine Ridge and other actions by the federal government, which to me show a very heavy-handed lawlessness. I'm not talking about mistakes in judgement. I'm talking about lawlessness that resulted in the unlawful taking of people's lives. And to me, that constitutes murder. But if it's done by the FBI or other federal minions, then it's smoothed over, it's whitewashed, and it's made all right. I don't like the way federal agents have dealt with black people and poor people in Nebraska. I don't like the fact that a black FBI agent working in the Omaha office had his...the faces of pictures of his family members defaced by white agents who pasted pictures of apes and monkeys over his family, and the FBI tried to cover this up and make it all right, and he was transferred out of Nebraska, and nothing of consequence was done to those racists. So this bill is going to be the place where I show the FBI and the federal government that when they try to come through this Legislature while I'm here and gain any kind of benefit or boon or assist, I'm going to do all I can to stop them. I don't care about any other bills that are pending on Select File today. I don't care about any other bills that are pending anywhere at any stage in the Legislature. Senator Kristensen, my opposition has nothing to do with you carrying the bill, but any bill I become aware of that is doing something for the federal government, I'm going after it. This morning, on General File, on the consent calendar, was a bill that Senator Beutler has, it might be LB 702, and it has something to
