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we'll have, and I would assume you know the problems of child care and it being available, but probably even more than that would be the availability of jobs. And in the original bill, we did talk about there is assistance for people who are needing to relocate...if there is not employment available. And I don't know where that would be, but, say, it happened to be Valentine, though, or some, Broken Bow, I would assume those would be the areas that may be serving the people and those would have to be the, I would assume, where you would have to have some type of child care facility available for those people who show up for work and need somewhere to have their children placed in child care.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I envision probably Valentine and Broken Bow. I was just wondering if there would be anything any place else, or would they have to all work in them two towns, and that's something that's got to be worked out year, I suppose.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I suppose, and I don't know what...how many jobs would be available in those other areas, and it may...you know, there may be a need for the clients, when they sign a contract, and when they get their training, to move more towards Broken Bow or Valentine or those areas that would have the jobs available to the clients.

SENATOR JONES: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Chris Peterson.

SENATOR C. PETERSON: Yes, Madam Chairman, members of the body. Senator Wesely, could I ask you some questions?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Sure.

SENATOR C. PETERSON: And I apologize for this, I don't know...I cannot find my numbers. Currently, what is the number...do we have a number for the legal immigrants that are currently in Nebraska, currently in Nebraska?
