states. And so we'll wait and see when Senator Wehrbein's bill comes up if it gets the support. Obviously I'm not going to support it. But my point in this whole issue is if in fact his bill does not pass or if we don't get to it, and certainly I think as a responsible group of people it's our responsibility to provide some kind of protection as far as monetarily...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...to those people who are going to be...who are going to be obviously pressured, or basically forced, because if they don't pay taxes and they decide to force the issue, that land can be put up for tax sale. And I don't think anybody wants that to happen. And I think we need to be responsible and to provide some protection for those people. So I'd ask you to support LB 588A. Thank you very much.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. You've heard the closing. The issue before the body is the advancement to E & R Initial of LB 588A. All of those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 588A.
