the cost of the project. And I've tried to listen to the debate, but I missed part of it. And so I'm not sure I know, even though I've looked at the fiscal note, I'm not sure that I can tell you what the total cost of this project is going to be. Is it that 800 and some thousand dollars that's in the fiscal note?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Hillman.

SENATOR HILLMAN: The total cost of the project is 1.6 million, \$800,000 is already been...is already in place, one-fourth from the community colleges, and one-fourth from Scottsbluff High School. The 800,000 was a request, but we've reduced that fiscal note to 250,000, and we're looking at other areas of grants and foundations to be able to help us with the rest of it.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, and I'm sure you've said that a number of times already before.

SENATOR HILLMAN: That's fine.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I just hadn't picked up on it.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Sure.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So, what you're asking the state now is 250,000 in General Funds...

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...of that 800,000. And how much of that would you be asking then that Special Education Trust Fund for? How much would you be asking them for?

SENATOR HILLMAN: I'd have to pull out, and I can't tell you that right off the bat. I'd have to pull out what is directly associated with the K through 12 and what is associated with the community college, because the lottery funds, or the fund that you referred to does not cover anything at the community college, it only funds K through 12.
