SPEAKER WITHEM: Committee amendment is..amendment 190 is adopted. Mr. Clerk, I understand you might have some items for the record?

Senator Chambers would like to print amendments to (LB) 864; Senator Robak to (LB) 401. SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bohlke, it's my understanding you now wish to go to division three, which is FA191. Is that correct?

CLERK: Floor amendment 191, Mr. President, involves Section 20 of the bill addressing the process of considering petitions with respect to freeholdings in the school districts. (FA191 appears on page 1697 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bohlke, to open.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members. This is an issue that has probably been one that's been raised to the Education Committee in past years a number of times. And it's the issue that farmers usually have brought to the committee, and stated that many times they are affiliated with a high school, and that the cost per pupil of that high school is exceptionally high.
