community. They can't tax the income in the local community. We do that in 1059, but the local political subdivision, the school district, can't do it itself.

SENATOR ROBAK: Perhaps I'm simplifying this too much, as the question of access kept coming up and coming and coming up. That's what this amendment will do. It would...we already access the incomes...the income streams in allotted tax funds. This amendment, as I've said, and Senator Landis said here, is additional access to income, in my amendment, through state tax returns. The Department of Revenue reprograms...reprograms on the basis of the formula on the handouts that I just gave everybody. And it's multiplied out as the factors in place since 1059. We not increasing sales and income tax at all. I mean, maybe it's too complicated, maybe it's too simple, I don't know. This is...we copied the Missouri plan. This is the Missouri income tax formula plan for the schools distribution. It works in Missouri, for heaven's sakes. If it works in Missouri, it can certainly work here. It's not that we should pass all of Missouri's plans and go home. We could do that right now if we wanted to, but it does work in Missouri, there's no reason why it can't work here. Senator Maurstad, I would like to ask him a question. He is not here. I'd like to ask him how his concept that he seemed to have, pass out, his little chart, how that differs from my income factor which is the district having adjusted gross income per return divided by the state average adjusted gross income per return, minus one. This income factor would lower the district's local effort, if their AGI per return is below the state average. It would raise the district's local effort, if their AGI per return is above the state average. It's very simple, it's very simple, indeed. I don't think that Senator Maurstad has looked at my amendment so much. And Senator Schellpeper talked about going on to an interim study, and we've had interim studies since 1059. We'll have interim studies till the cows come home. You don't get too much out of an interim study unless you really want to put your heart into it. And we have this right here. This came out of many interim studies. We have LB 806. Senator Wickersham sees some flaws in my amendment. I think he has a good idea there. I think we should pass this right now, this amendment to the bill on Select File. Senator Wickersham, Senator Schellpeper, myself and Senator Maurstad who seemed to like this concept so
