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learns at a different rate during different times of their life so I...I disagree with the fact that if we...if we go ahead and let them have an all-day kindergarten instead of going home with their parents during that other half a day, that they get behind other students. I...I don't think that that's true. I don't think that my children were damaged spending that time with me at home, and it certainly was precious hours of their growing-up period that I really appreciated. So I guess I can't agree with the Stuhr amendment because it does give an advantage to the Millard District, who have those all-day kindergartens, who do receive those...that extra money per student to be able to give that all-day kindergarten to those parents who want it. And I know that there's parents out there who think that there's an advantage to an all-day kindergarten as far as academically, that their children gain an advantage. I don't happen to agree with that. And I know that there's parents out there who, quite honestly, have said to me that it's a money savings to them to go to an all-day kindergarten situation, from a half-day kindergarten situation where they would have to pay for child care, and that's full-time working parents, for the other half a day. So there's a lot of considerations and different ideas that go into putting children into...into an all-day kindergarten situation, and I do feel that if some of the areas that can't afford that extra classroom space or don't have that extra classroom space are being put at a disadvantage, that is true, but there are other weighted areas in this formula. So, you know, if we're going to accept this formula, this 1059 formula, the state has accepted since way back in 1990, as the way to distribute funds to the schools, then I, you know, I guess this is just one of those weighted areas that we...I know it's not a new area. It's been there. That's why Millard put it in because our students were opting into Westside because they had the all-day kindergarten time, and the classroom space at that time. But I...I really couldn't let it go by that everyone was standing up and saying how wonderful all day kindergarten it is without saying that there's a lot of families out there who sacrifice to stay home with their children, and I think are...are really not putting their children at any disadvantage, and for anyone to suggest that by going to an all-day kindergarten you have such a tremendous advantage is...is in and of it, and I think to suggest that if we keep them home for half a day, that they're at a disadvantage, and I
