PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...of how state aid is done, that the second class cities are going to get considerably more money because those are the ones that seem to be impacted the most. This is not a draconian effort, but an effort to bring some orderly process. We spelled out in this statute the requirements so that this commission couldn't invent new thresholds to jump over. Couldn't invent new thresholds to jump over. The decision is yours with respect to this because this is the lynch-pin upon which the rest of the bill pivots. Thank you.
