PRESIDENT ROBAK PRESIDING

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Good morning and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain this morning is Chaplain Harland Johnson.

REVEREND JOHNSON: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. I now call the sixty-seventh day to order. Will senators please record their presence. Please record.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: Page 1749, last line, strike "printed separately" and insert "on file". That's all that I had, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Any messages, reports, and announcements?

CLERK: One item, Natural Resources reports Legislative Resolution 110 back to the Legislature for further consideration. That's the only item I have, Madam President. (See page 1770 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: We then turn to special order General File bills and LB 306. The Chair recognizes Senator Withem for comment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, this is...doesn't deal with LB 306, it deals with announcements, an announcement I'd like to make concerning today's agenda. Had a conversation with some people in the Revenue Committee regarding the list of bills on the agenda today. LB 306 is the first one, obviously. We will be continuing to deal with that. LB 271, there has been a request by members of the Revenue Committee pending getting the data ready to pass over that bill. I thought because LB 180 is a simple bill in concept, but a pretty wide reaching concerns on that bill, that we ought to give notice that there is a good
