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believe that we could come back. I think we did this on the lottery issue, if I'm not mistaken, did the intent legislation, enabling legislation, and then came back and ratified it in the next session.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: We've done it in a variety of things. We did it on the, for example, the TERC, we did it on lottery, we did it on the Court of Appeals, at least we had it up there for a year out there for them to look at the structure, ch, personal property was another one. We did the personal property tax, passed the amendment, then came back and reenacted the legislation. So it's not an uncommon thing to do that.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, thank you very much. And, with that, I guess I would ask you to go ahead and enact one of these amendments. And I don't have a huge preference for one or the other, but I think we should do...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...one of them.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Beutler, your light is next, followed by Senators Wesely, Lynch, Jensen, Robinson, Chambers, Kristensen, and Tyson.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, sometimes I think we get off on what, in my mind, is kind of a radical track on some of these things. We have a long history of initiative and referendum in this state. And I think that by and large, with the exception of a few pieces maybe in the last couple of years, it's been a good history, and it's been a check on the Legislature that's been used sparingly, and has not been used unwisely, maybe once or twice some would say so, but that's a matter of opinion. Now we are proposing to change that in the most radical way since the beginning of initiative and referendum by suggesting that the Legislature should have the power to decide who has to witness the signature and the number of locations. Obviously, if we are given that power, we will be given the power to destroy initiative and referendum, because all we have to do, if we don't reduce the number of signatures, all we have to do is decide there's only going to be one
