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of which, not most of which, but many of which ended up being discredited because they were not accurate. They had circulators that gave wrong addresses, it was a mess, it was a mess. We've got to clean that process up, that's the first order of business that we have to take. That's what Senator Kristensen is talking about, let's fix the process. Let's make this petition process what it was always intended to be, that is a grass-roots effort of people from Nebraska caring about Nebraska issues, trying to do something about making this state even better for the future. That's the petition process that I remember when I got started in it. But it's not the process we have now, for the most part, in the state of Nebraska. Yeah, you have a lot of people that start the effort and take some leadership at the state level. But it ultimately ends up being these out-of-state money, or out-of-state circulators that are brought in at the end to rush forward. And you end up with a system that does not represent the overall best interests of the citizens of the state of Nebraska. So by having us go into an office designated by this Legislature, by having it clearly identified, you don't have the potential for these paid circulators going around, you stop that abuse. Now you may end up with somebody being paid, directing folk in. You know, a lot of petitions are circulated outside of county court houses. You still have that. You won't have the petition there, but you'll have somebody maybe being paid, saying, why don't you go on down to the clerk's office and sign up here, you know, so you'll still have that influence. But at least the individual isn't pressured at that moment by somebody, you know, who makes a buck every time they get a signature. You know, they...and it's hard to say no, we all know that. And it's part of our job, we have to say it all the time, and it's hard to do. So somebody comes up to you, they say, why don't you sign this, it will just put it on the ballot, it doesn't really matter, you'll have a chance to vote on it later. You know, nine out of ten they say, yeah, sure, you know, what difference does it make to me, and they sign up on the petition. Well, you know, that situation is not what we want. We want individuals who care about the issue, who are from Nebraska, that want to see something done that will benefit Nebraska, out there advocating for the position, having a chance to express themselves. That's the system that I think we want to get back to. Unfortunately, the court ruling that destroyed that still stands, it says you can't block these paid
