CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the committee amendments is by Senators Hillman, Withem, and Wehrbein.

SENATOR WILL: Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: I believe Senator Hillman was the primary sponsor and she'd indicated to me that she preferred to pass that over and do it on...either way, when she returns or on Select File, whichever comes first.

SENATOR WILL: The amendment is passed over for the time being. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Stuhr would move to amend and she's excused, Mr. President.

SENATOR WILL: Is anyone authorized to carry the Stuhr amendment? Don't see anyone. That amendment will be passed over as well.

CLERK: Senator Chambers. AM2023, Senator. (AM2023 appears on page 1892 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WILL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I hope everybody will follow what is going to be said now, not because I'm saying it, that's one reason, but what I'm saying is far more important than the fact that I'm the one saying it. I have talked to several senators about what I had mentioned earlier in terms of isolating out of this bill all of the material that relates to Corrections. So I have amendments on 389 and (LB) 386, which is the capital construction bill, to pull that material out. We will then, Monday, have LB 150 on General File, and I have agreed that everything that would be found in 389 and the amendments that the Appropriations Committee is proposing will be...and (LB) 386...would be put into LB 150. (LB) 150 would then become a part of the budget package, and at that point, I would put up the arguments that I
