SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, my goodness. Okay, thank you, Senator Wehrbein. I asked the wrong question to the second person. I do have problems with it. And the Governor knows that nobody speaks for me. But I thought sure...I thought sure that what I read meant that 401 was just going to slide right on across and we were going to get down into these other bills. But while I'm doing this, is Senator Dwite Pedersen in the house?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Dwite Pedersen.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yes, sir, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Dwite Pedersen, I see that you have a bill just resting there, not bothering anything or anybody, LB 603, kind of hiding in the bushes behind LB 401. Is that true?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yes, Senator Chambers, it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Has the Governor contacted you to tell you that there's no opposition to this bill and that everything is all right on in now?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: No, he has not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think there's going to be a little opposition on your bill?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: On 603, yes, I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would it surprise you if I told you that I have a little opposition to it?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: You're the only opposition I know of, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Dwite Pedersen. I just want people to know that I'm going to be put to a test today. I'm not going to get away by just talking this morning. You all are going to keep me on my feet and just whoop me right down to my shoelaces. Then 99, bingo, Senator Will is not here. But I
