SENATOR BRUNING: Madam President, I move LB 852A to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR CROSBY: Discussion on 852A? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this is Senator Crosby's bill and it gives me great pleasure to tell how much respect I have for Senator Crosby. And at some point, when I have more time, but I won't take it today, I'm going to explain how Bill Cosby got his name, Senator Crosby. It has nothing to do with you, but it has to do with a person who is well known to everybody whose last name is Crosby, his first name being Bing. That's all I have to say on Senator Crosby's bill though. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the motion to advance LB 852A to E & R for engrossing. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. (LB) 861A.
