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conversation while others were, were speaking on the microphone, and you showed me a little bit of the task force or the committee report that you had alluded to. And is it accurate to say that that report did not really specify the order as between staff development technology and instructional materials, that it did not really specify an order, or is that an accurate statement?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Bromm, if I can read the recommendation, and like I said earlier, that this represented...the two senators were on this committee were Senator Bohlke and myself. There was two representative of ESU, there were two superintendents representing both a small school and a large school, a board member from an ESU, and then there were two...and a board member from a local school district. And the way that the recommendation, and I'll read the recommendations of this report, which was in October 1996, was, these core services shall be determined and defined within the service delivery areas of staff development, technology, and instructional material services. So I guess when I went to the Education Committee, and I don't know whether you were there at that time, but that's...I think I, you know, I said, staff development should be number one, technology should be number two, and instructional material. And I think this, you know, all these recommendations passed this, you know, this task force, with no dissenting votes, so.

SENATOR BROMM: Right.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: I guess I'm just asking whether it's clear...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: ...that that was the order specified or whether that was just the order they were listed, and that kind of carried through.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And I, yeah, and I think that's, you know, the intent was that staff development was first, you know, technology and so forth was second.
