SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Bohlke, would you please respond?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bohlke, does that mean then that that 19 cents would be off of the...they would not have that to spend at the local level then, they'd be minus that?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: So if there was a...they'd be minus a total...if they ask for 19 cents, which is the limit I guess or the high,...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Then it would probably, I mean I doubt that there would be any high school that would approve 19 cents.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I know. But I mean that could be the scenario, could be.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes. And then that would be that much less.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It would be that much less. And so they're really not...it's really not a gift, it's really not a gift then you might say. I mean they're going to be minus that.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Explain one more time about (LB) 306, if this does not happen, or if 306 does not happen...or why...

SENATOR BOHLKE: We...there is, I think, discussion within the Revenue Committee that they've come up with a plan, under 306, to address this. If that had not happened, we needed to have something in 806 that established what this limit would be and how the relationship would take place. I hope that 306 is moved along, and then when it is this is no longer necessary and 306 covers is.

SENATOR CUDABACK: So 306 would be a better scenario then, would be a better picture.
