SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Brown. Do I see five hands? I do. The question before the house is, shall debate cease? All in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Debate has ceased. Senator Bohlke, you are recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I think we've had a good discussion, some good questions, and, you know, I think that the more printouts you get, the more you understand it. And I think you've done a great job of understanding something that could be very complicated. From the questions you've asked, I think most of you understand what we're doing here and will allow us to proceed with offering this part onto the bill and eventually getting to the next amendment and being able to address the needs of some of the schools some of you have always been concerned with. So with that I thank you, and ask for your support and the adoption.
