SPEAKER WITHEM: ...different.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...of everything, all the bills and everything, is there any money out there for the cities and villages, if that doesn't come up?

SPEAKER WITHEM: My sense, Senator Robinson, was that the numbers that I run just for my own personal purposes, we could do about \$120 million of personal, or property tax relief if we watch our spending, pass a modest income tax cut. That additional \$10 million now that would be left over would probably be fought over by the other subdivisions if this amendment passes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Thank you.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We are really in a lovefest here. Senator Robak is even over giving me a hug. I just want to add my support to this amendment to the A bill of LB 806, and in all of these discussions we have had, and I think I have stated on the floor before, I have been more than willing to put more money toward making sure more schools were taken care of and were not forced, especially those that were viable, to make cuts so severe we are seriously influencing or affecting the quality of education in that school within those classrooms. With that, I will be brief and add my support to the amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: Question please.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Do I see five hands? I do. The question before the house is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.
