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wouldn't you agree?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would think so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I'll turn my light on again, because I have a few more questions.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Madam President, members. I guess I have a question for Senator Beutler or Senator Brown.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Beutler, will you yield?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Senator Beutler. Along that same line that Senator Chambers was discussing there, are they going to send this list out to every financial institution in the state?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I think that the correct answer to that is that, generally speaking, they will have an idea where bank accounts might be, and they could choose to send to particular banks, or if they...this is all done by computer, computers at both ends. It certainly could be sent to every...there's nothing that would prohibit it being sent to every bank in the state.

SENATOR SCHMITT: I guess when you're dealing with these type of people that would be delinquent on their child support payments, I don't know how they would know which financial institution these people would be using, because some of these people move around a lot. And I've also heard people comment out there that if this goes through, they may move their bank accounts out of state. How are...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, it won't do them...

SENATOR SCHMITT: ...we going to track these people?
