PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 806 pass? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2420 of Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 13 nays, Madam President, on the passage of LB 806.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 806 passes. LB 806A. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Thank you, Madam President. Enrollment and Review reports LB 91, (LB) 569, (LB) 626, (LB) 729, (LB) 99, (LB) 90, (LB) 90A, (LB) 626A, (LB) 829A to Select File. Senator Withem, and amendment to (LB) 104; Senator Chambers amendments to (LB) 150; and Senator Will to (LB) 512A. (See pages 2420-28 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, with respect to LB 806A, Senator Hilgert would move to return the bill for specific amendment. (See FA396 on page 2428 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Hilgert to open on the motion.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Madam President and members. The amendment is very simple. On page 2, line 9, it strikes \$110,000,000 and inserts \$85,000,000. I bring this amendment for one simple reason. The specter of reduced property taxes under LB 1114 is fleeting, at best. We should not be taking additional state aid from the budget, writing blank checks to
