CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bill is returned. Senator Brashear, to open on your amendment. (AM1724 appears on page 1676 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I've made the presentation. I'd ask that the amendment be adopted. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: All in favor of adoption of the amendment, say aye...or vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Select File amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bruning.

SENATOR BRUNING: Mr. President, I move LB 137 to E & R for engrossing.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the motion. All of those in favor say aye. Opposed. It is readvanced. Mr. Clerk, LB 197.

CLERK: (LB) 197, Mr. President. Senator Kristensen would move to return the bill for specific amendment, AM2091.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I filed a request to return LB 197. Senator Dierks has been kind enough to allow me to do this. This is to allow the contents of LB 476 to be added to that. I believe Senator Wesely also has had an opportunity to review this. LB 476 was the bill that has come out of the Health Committee. Basically it was on consent as well, but it deals in the area of licenses that have...and these are primarily the Uniform Licensing Laws where someone has gone inactive or moved away or just not used their license for a period of years, particularly if they did this prior to 1988.
