

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE  
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LB 91, 829A

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion to advance LB 829A. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. LB 91.

CLERK: Madam President, 91, Senator Bruning, I have Enrollment and Review amendments to LB 91, Senator.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Bruning.

SENATOR BRUNING: Madam President, I move to adopt the E & R amendments.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 91. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, the first amendment I have to the bill, motion, I should say, is by Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers would move to indefinitely postpone. Senator Robak would have the option to lay the bill over. Senator Robak is excused.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to withdraw that motion.

SENATOR CROSBY: No objections? It is withdrawn.

CLERK: The next motion I have, Senator Withem. Senator Withem would move to indefinitely postpone the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Robak is excused, Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yeah. Going to raise a point here regarding this motion to indefinitely postpone. And I may end up withdrawing it. I know Senator Kristensen is working on an amendment to the bill, and I don't want the bill... I'm a very strong supporter of LB 91. It's a bill that I think we need to pass. I'm looking at the rule, Madam President, and the rule, I think, reads a little differently than we normally apply it. It indicates, I'm looking at Rule 7, Section 3, subparagraph (a), later on it says, "When any of the following motions shall be made, any action on such motion shall be delayed at least one
