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will be following up once that decision is made and, if they are a recipient, to see...to help them do it the right way and in accordance with the federal rules. As far as I can see, insofar as they're dealing with these facilities' capitalization program, which is the bulk of the program, all other contacts will continue to be with the Department of Health.

SENATOR CUDABACK: So some of the worries these smaller communities had, those worries will no longer need to be there?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, Senator, I can't pretend that I accurately know what all of their...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...worries are.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But to the extent that their worries had to do with dealing with a different set of people, I would think that they should no longer be worried.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Any time we see a change I guess we worry or we wonder what the...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...you know...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...ramifications might be. With that, I guess this needed to be done so thank you for your work and Senator Schellpeper's work also. And thanks for the two cents, Senator Schellpeper. He said it wasn't worth it, but he did pay me my two cents, so thank you.
