SPEAKER WITHEM PRESIDING

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a double standard like that and it's a double standard on its face, you don't have to interpret the law. But with one group it says the license shall be suspended, and with the other exactly situated the same way, it may be suspended. And I want to give people another assurance. What I have to say will not take me three or four hours, I assure you of that. Oh, and I will ask to withdraw this amendment.
