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hardheaded, practical people of the world are realizing that if you can engage a child's mind and imagination, you can do far more to alter that child's conduct and behavior than you can by threatening to put a policeman on every corner and all the other types of approaches that have been undertaken. So if we were willing to expend this modest amount, \$75,000, I don't think it could be spent for a better purpose, next to the vote we just took, so I hope you will take this as a serious motion, realize that the arts are extremely important. If you look around this building, look at the ceiling, look at all that work done in the corridors and the hallways, there's a floor someplace in this building where a number of murals were commissioned to be painted, you've got a piece of artwork sitting on top of this building that signifies what this state is about, every place you look, these cups that you have on your desk, they are decorated and they are decorated for the purpose of reaching that layer inside of each one of us that ordinarily is not touched. When they built this building they could have built a big square, box-like structure, but they did it differently from that, and they did it differently because they are aiming at something which is beyond the strictly physical and material. I hope that you will vote to override in this instance.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam Speaker, members, Senator Chambers makes some good points. I think it's time to shut the door is all I have to say. We're down to about \$1.6 million now, and I don't know whether others are going to come or how successful other overrides will be, but I still do not want to go home... I'm not saying below 3, I have high hopes we will not go home below 3 percent, but I shouldn't think that we should go home with just at the 3 percent. It's 75,000 here, and 100,000 there, and pretty quick we have real money. And it's something, I think, that there is a \$75,000 increase in the Arts Council yet. We'd added 150, this cut it back to \$75,000 increase now, so there is additional money in here. So I think it's reasonable at this point. I don't think that we need to add more. I would urge that we move on with these issues, let's sustain the vetoes at this point and move on, go home with at least a million and a half or so above minimum reserve.
