PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. The question before the body is the motion to return LB 364 to Select File to strike the enacting clause. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 5 ayes, 28 nays, Madam President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion to return the bill fails.

CLERK: I have nothing further...I have nothing further pending to the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The first vote is the motion to suspense with Final Reading, pursuant to Rule 6, Section 8. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please return.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 1 nay to dispense with Final Reading.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Final Reading is dispensed with. LB 364.

CLERK: (Read title of LB 364.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 364 pass? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. There has been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2748 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 18 nays, 1 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting on the final passage, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 364 passes. LB 150.

CLERK: Senator Chambers, I understand your amendments go away, Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, it gives me pleasure to do what I'm about to do, but I want to explain something first. If we'd have had to go to eight hours, I would have had to have 20 amendments, because I could speak
