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Senator Coordsen, Senator Matzke, Senator Schrock. Senator Matzke, report to the Chamber. Senator Coordsen, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Abboud. The house is under call. Senator Abboud, please report to the Chamber. Senator Schellpeper. We're looking for Senator Schellpeper, Senator Abboud. Senator Schellpeper, the house is under call.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We'll take a machine vote.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Everyone is present. The question before the house is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to amendment 3 to the rules. All those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have nothing further pending to amendment number 3, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The call is raised. Senator Chambers, you are recognized to speak on the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many times will I have to speak now, Mr. Speaker, because I'm lost on where we are on that now?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Just a moment, Senator Chambers, I'll check. You have one remaining time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: After this one, or this is it?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: This is your time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Maybe Senator Tyson will yield me some time if I need to, because we're at a very critical point in considering this rule. First of all, I want to comment on that last vote. There were 39 "yes" votes and not a "no" vote up there, and it was my amendment. And you vote...the only time I get all those votes is on an amendment that I don't like, that I didn't even vote for, and I get 39 ayes. And the proposed rule
