minute, and then if the vote...if you want to shut down the board at that point you just simply say I'd like a roll call vote and ask people to check in. And then you just make sure everybody's here and you go forward with the vote. There's an easy way to deal with that problem. You are not stymied at all. All your prerogatives are retained. It just simply takes a three-minute wait and makes it a one-minute wait, and if there's any difficulty at all there's an easy way to remedy it. I see no difficulty whatsoever that will call for this to happen. Because, again, we're on Final Reading. We're not like here on General File or Select File where people are coming and going. So this will save time and it won't be a difficulty. You won't get caught by surprise. The additional motion votes that go on have confused people in the past. This way we can package the vote. And I thank Senator Chambers for making the language more correct. The amendment's in good shape to the rules. I'd ask your support for this rule change. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing on amendment number 3 to the permanent rules. All those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 276 of the Legislative Journal.) 13 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The amendment is not adopted. Items for the record?
