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organize that undifferentiated information and guide them to a conclusion through the answers they gave to his questions. So the teacher often doesn't impart new information. The teacher simply guides what the person already knows. But the teacher is necessary because even though the person has this information, he or she doesn't know when it has been properly synthesized and put together. If Senator Tyson would give his best thinking to this, he would arrive at the point where the rest of us who are intelligent, thoughtful, logical, and reasonable have arrived. A policy of this kind, if extended throughout the society, would readily be seen as something unwise. Many things start out small, then they get larger. There was a young singer named Brenda Lee, and she said, start out slow, work your way on up. Every old hound dog once was a pup, take one step at a time. Boy, just one step at a time. She was about 11 years old when she sang that and sounded like she was 30. But at any rate, things do grow that way when we put legislation on the books. I probably don't have the time now, but I'm going to turn on my light because I want to ask Senator Tyson a couple of questions, not taking you through a whole series, but a couple of basic questions.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam President, members of the body, I thought my good friend here, Senator Schmitt, had a...what they did in the Patrol that is part of an employment contract, that you can say to the person when they apply for the police department that they can keep them...or the individual has to, has to pay back. And that sounds to me rather than putting something in state statutes, maybe this is something that can be done at the local...at the local level. And I guess also people made comments to me was that, well, you'd be sued. And I guess, I'm looking at a couple of attorneys ahead of me, Senator Matzke and Senator Landis, what about that? Could a city, or a community or a village, put into their contract a proviso that if I'm an...if I'm recruited by Nickerson, Senator Janssen's home town, if I was recruited as a policeman in Nickerson, that Nickerson, through their city council or village council could say that if you're going to be trained at Grand Island training school, that we can...you have to work so many years. whatever
