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eight ball to actually get something going this year, to show that in good faith that they are going to do something, and hopefully that we can get something started. So that is what the amendment does and it explains to you. And everybody should have a list on their desk of all the committee people to show exactly who they are. And there's one from each county, there's four counties so there's four commissioners on there. There's three NRDs that's represented, so there's three NRD members on there. And then there's the Forestry's got a member on there, and also Game and Parks has got a member on there. Fish and Wildlife's got a member on it. And so...and then there's, the rest of them are made up of local ranchers that's along the river. But they're dealing with a lot of government ground along there already, so they go to work out the details between the landowners and the government ground, and hopefully they can work this out locally and keep it all locally controlled. And that's the goal of it, so hopefully that we can give them this start-up money to get something going. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Jones, I would like to ask if Senator Jones yield to a question.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Jones, you yield?

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I will.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Obviously I'm interested in the A bill that is still coming with this at 50,000 for the next two years.

SENATOR JONES: It's going to be 100,000 for this year, 50,000 for next year, and 25,000 for the following year.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Ooh, okay. Okay. Well, I support the scenic river and the Niobrara and I do agree it's not only a Nebraska treasure but a national treasure, so I am supportive of that. That is a little steeper than I thought. And I want to be assured, first of all, that this will not go on forever, that that is an absolute, and also I want to know if we do not do this, what's the result?
