CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 656A.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 656A advances. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Yes, Madam President, thank you. Your Committee on Judiciary, chaired by Senator Brashear, reports (LB) 966 to General File, (LB) 969 General File, (LB) 970 General File, (LB) 1067 General File, (LB) 950 indefinitely postponed, (LB) 958 indefinitely postponed, (LB) 1018 indefinitely postponed, (LB) 1083 indefinitely postponed, those reports signed by Senator Brashear. I also have hearing notices from Natural Resources, Education, Transportation and from the Executive Board, all signed by the respective chairs. That's all that I have, Madam President. (See pages 415-16 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Brown would like to recognize Dr. David Filipi of Omaha, who is serving as the family Doctor of the Day today on behalf of the Nebraska Academy of Family Physicians. Dr. Filipi is sitting under the north balcony. Will you please stand and be recognized. Welcome, Dr. Filipi. We now turn to General File and 1998 senator priority bills. LB 320.

CLERK: Madam President, 320 introduced by Senator Bohlke. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 14 of last year, at that time referred to the Transportation Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments. (See AM0856 referred to on page 996 of the Legislative Journal, First Session.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Bohlke to open on the bill.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Madam President and members. I bring you good news that I bring you a bill that does concern youth, but it doesn't concern state aid to schools, and it didn't require a printout. But what the bill does do is try to
