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we're willing to do that work. And on this bill it seems that that is the approach that we're going to take. And, Mr. Speaker, I will yield back whatever time may remain to me.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Senator Bohlke. We have an amendment on the desk. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bohlke would move to amend the committee amendments. (See FA461 on page 433 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bohlke, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members. I'm just getting a copy here in front of me. While we spoke earlier on the issue that we had amended the sections that Senator Chambers had wanted amended earlier, we said that it did not fit with those who had a learners permit. This goes, if you read I think it's before you on page 3, line 5, and on page 11, line 17, on line 18, and on line 19, if you have the amendment before you, you can see that this goes to those sections that deal with a learners permit, doing essentially the same thing that Senator Chambers raised initially in the other sections that were amended. It strikes the two years, essentially, that they do not have to be licensed for two years. With that, will try to answer any questions someone may have. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bohlke, your light is on to debate the amendment. She waives off. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I'm going over the amendment to be certain that it is what I could agree with. So while my time is running, I'm going to look at it. It shouldn't take too long. Senator Bromm, I'd like to ask you a question.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, will you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How much time is left, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Approximately four minutes.
