SPEAKER KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Good morning and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain for the day is Pastor Don White from the Cornerstone Church in Omaha. Pastor.

PASTOR WHITE: (Prayer offered.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I call the fourteenth day to order. Roll call. Senators, please check in.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Any messages, reports, or announcements?

CLERK: Government Committee reports (LB) 995 to General File with amendments, and I have a hearing notice from the Government Committee, those reports signed by Senator Robinson. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 449-50 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We next move to General File, LB 834. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (LB) 834 by Senator Tyson. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 22 of 1997, referred to Business and Labor, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Tyson, you are recognized to open on LB 834.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. LB 834 is a very simple bill that adds four words, "or limited liability company", to 48-648 which has to do with a payment (recording fades--some debate lost) Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund.
