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to bring good jobs to the state of Nebraska. So that's why I'm doing this.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, Senator...Senator Brown, I think it's just a bit of good luck that has fallen on this state and other places around the country which doesn't have a great deal to do with what Nebraska has done, because studies have been undertaken to show that similar results have been obtained in states that don't give away what they have. But I was asking you this, and I don't know if you answered it, are you willing to, instead of jumping...dropping from seven years to drop to six years, or do you want to talk it over with those that you're working with?

SENATOR BROWN: Senator, I...I want to make this...this legislation workable for companies, heavy manufacturing companies. And I think that seven years is the amount of time that's necessary. So I don't think that I would be willing to look at anything less than that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What states have given this company you're interested in seven years to do what you're saying Nebraska ought to do for this company?

SENATOR BROWN: There is a company that is interested in locating in Nebraska. I don't know what...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does it operate in any other state?

SENATOR BROWN: Not that I'm aware of.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it operates only in Nebraska?

SENATOR BROWN: No, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's operating somewhere else in order to come here, right? You don't want to talk about that?

SENATOR BROWN: Not...not that I'm aware of.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. I...I would like to make a comment, it's going to be a paraphrase of what was attributed to
