SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Items for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, committee on Transportation reports LB 1057 to General File; (LB) 42, General File with amendments; (LB) 1056, General File with amendments; (LB) 286, (LB) 792, (LB) 996, (LR) 31CA and (LR) 44CA as indefinitely postponed. I have hearing notices from the Business and Labor Committee, General Affairs Committee, and Appropriations Committee, all signed by their respective Chairs. (Also Health and Human Services Committee announces LB 1073 as its priority bill. See pages 486-90 of the Legislative Journal.) Senator Chambers has amendments to (LB) 777 to be printed.
