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believe the point that Senator Wesely has been making, in that this would, in fact, predetermine, if we change "shall" to "may" it doesn't predetermine anything, but it does get to the heart of what, if I understand Senator Brown and the purpose for her bringing this amendment, it would allow for a plan to be developed by the Health and Human Services to look at more than just doing it the way that we are now, submit the legislation to us, the program would have an implementation date the same as what the Brown amendment has. Now, I think with this change, this makes this amendment workable within the context of LB 1063. I, for one, am not, have not been convinced yet that there has been adequate study to determine the best route for Nebraska to go to provide this additional health insurance protection to some of our, some of our working families' children. The federal government gave us three options to look at. I think that it behooves us to move forward, but I also do not believe that it's in the best interest, long term, to confine us to how we start. Now, by me not being convinced is not to say that there hasn't been ample work done by either the administration or the Health Committee or individual members. But in what I have read and the information that has been provided to me up to this point, I'm not convinced that every option has been examined. I certainly, unless it's lost somewhere on my desk in my office, certainly not seen any hard data on comparisons of different possible ways to go about this along the lines of what some of the other states are looking at, Iowa, Wisconsin, to name a couple. So I think that given the fact that this is certainly going to be the train that leaves the station, I think that the Brown amendment certainly allows me to be supportive of this effort initially. And with my amendment changing "shall" to "may" provides the opportunity for the Department of Health and Human Services to explore a number of oppor...different options and then come back to us with a recommendation. I think a two-year period is certainly a reasonable period of time for them to accomplish that. I realize they have a lot on their plate right now, continuing to work through the partnership and the effort that it's taken to get that up and rolling. I tend to think that may be one of the reason's that we're taking this route on this piece of legislation, but that's just a supposition on my part. So with that, Madam President, I will conclude my introduction remarks on this amendment. As I said before, it changes one word in the
