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on which all the other laws of the state are erected. It does not mean that I respect as being wise everything that currently is in the constitution. I think we do have bunglesome, unclear, unnecessary language in the constitution now. While we're embarking upon an effort to amend it we should, I think, show more precision than we are showing in 45CA. Nothing has to be done on any of the issues that I'm raising now at all. If it's thought that something should be done, it doesn't have to be done while we're talking about the committee amendments. And in any case, I certainly am not going to offer any amendments that are designed to make clear what is happening with 45CA, but I may offer some amendments to muddy the water and give me an opportunity to attack what I see as being not good ideas. I do not think, in its present form, LR 45CA embodies sound public policy. Maybe I'm the only one who sees the importance or necessity of defining an entirely new concept that is being brought into the taxing law of the state. So, I will...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...discuss some parts of this proposal. And, as I stated, I may offer some amendments to give me the opportunity to discuss parts of the proposal. But I doubt that I will push any of the amendments all the way to a vote. I will speak for the purpose of calling attention to what I see as problems, so that if anybody does attack what is in LR 45CA, whether to try to keep it from being adopted when it's placed on the ballot, if it is, or if there are elements and aspects of laws that are challenged which laws are passed pursuant to vague, indefinite provisions in this proposal.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOD: Thank you, Madam President. Would Senator Wickersham yield to a question?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR ABBOD: Senator Wickersham, I'm trying to get a clarification as far as what the committee amendments do. And reading through the amendment, and reading through the explanation of the amendments I'm having trouble finding the
