Senator Willhoft. (Read by title for the first time.) (LB) 204A by Senator Abboud. (Read by title for the first time.) And (LB) 820A by Senator Wickersham. (Read by title for the first time.) Enrollment and Review reports (LB) 234 as correctly engrossed. And I have reports, Health and Human Services reports (LB) 1096 to General File with amendments. Transportation reports (LB) 962 to General File, (LB) 933, (LB) 1269, (LB) 1312 as indefinitely postponed. And Banking reports LB 1085 to General File, LB 1235 to General File, LB 1277 indefinitely postponed, LB 1307 indefinitely postponed, and LB 1320 indefinitely postponed. These reports signed by the respective chairs. I have a confirmation report from the Banking Committee. And I have amendments to be printed, Senator Lynch, LB 1075 and Senator Landis to (LB) 1162. PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business I propose to sign and do hereby sign LR 324. We're back to the Brashear amendment, Senator Brashear, your light is next. Senator Matzke, do you wish to speak to the Brashear amendment? Senator Beutler, to speak to the Brashear amendment. SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I have to use any amendment that is offered by anybody to discuss my concerns and interests relative to the judicial system in Nebraska and how it is functioning through individuals who are serving as judges. I had told Senator Brashear that I have not offered any motions on the bill. I have offered no amendments. But if people call the question, then I'm going to offer some because I intend to speak and I intend to be heard. So there are people who are not on this bill, and if they call the question, then Senator Pedersen and Senator Brashear are going to have to tell them, leave this discussion alone because I'm not going to be toyed with and trifled with. Senator Brashear has not done anything other than what he said he would do, nor Senator Pedersen. But because I agreed to an amendment does not mean that that's going to shackle me or muzzle me and I'm not going to deal with this bill. So if people are thinking
