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Committee of the Legislature shall review the provisions of Section 1 to 16 of this act before January 1, 2001, and every two years thereafter." This would say, "The Appropriations Committee and the Transportation Committee shall jointly review the provisions of the Sections 1 to 16." And the reason that...that I am filing this amendment and want to have some discussion is that I know when this bill came to...came to Exec Board for referencing, there was some question about the referencing, and it was decided that it should go to Appropriations Committee because they deal with a lot of issues that...that are concerns in the bill, and I understand that. But on the other hand, in the...particularly in the committee amendment that came out of Appropriations, we're now...we're now dealing with telecommunications systems. And I think...I could be wrong, but I think in one or...at least one or two places, telecommunications are inserted in the committee amendment and they were not in...it was not in the green copy of the bill. Historically in the last at least two or three years, telecommunications has been referred to the jurisdiction of the Transportation Committee, and I think if we're going to...we've got a lot of discussion we need to have on this bill, but if any part of it is going to touch on...on telecommunications, whether we're going to try to regulate duplication of telecommunications, make sure that telecommunications are usable by various segments of government and public entities, so that we can talk to each other and communicate efficiently with our telecommunications equipment, that the Transportation Committee at least ought to be, or have an opportunity to be, involved in the review process. And so it does not...this amendment does not, in my opinion, make any substantive change in the bill but simply inserts in that particular location, on page 14, that the review process that's conducted is conducted jointly by those two committees. And so I'd be glad to answer questions or entertain the thoughts or discussion that the body might have in that respect. But I do think...I do think there is a lot of merit in trying to coordinate the types of information that this bill attempts to coordinate. I will have some more...I will have some more questions as I try to understand more about the bill. As we all are in a session like this, we don't have the time to necessarily look into things in the depth that we'd like to, and this is a major bill. This is a very major bill, and the time that Senator Beutler has just spent, Senator Hillman
