CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 1193.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: LB 1193 advances. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. LB 1321 is reported by the Banking Committee to General File with amendments attached. Enrollment and Review reports LB 1035 as correctly engrossed. Senator Preister, amendments to (LB) 395; Senator Wickersham to LR 45; Senator Bohlke to (LB) 1229A. And I have a new resolution, LR 334 (read summary). (See pages 1020-22 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: We'll next move to LB 1086. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (LB) 1086, a bill by Senator Schellpeper. (Read title.) Introduced on January 12, referred to General Affairs, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schellpeper, you're recognized to open on LB 1086.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members. LB 1086 was a bill that we put in to try to do a few changes in the law that deal with race horse laws in this state that there's currently some gray area in the actual purse, how the purses will be divided for the breeders, and then also there's the way that we fund some of the alcohol treatment, and we take out some of the fines that are currently going to the wrong place. And so it's a combination of a whole bunch of things. But if I could, Mr. Chairman, I'd like to talk about the committee amendments, because they strike the original bill, and get into what the committee amendments are.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schellpeper, you're recognized to open on the committee amendments. (AM3394 appears on page 815 of the Legislative Journal.)
