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I'm digging myself a hole, I don't know. But I just wanted to...I appreciate your...

SENATOR WESELY: Sure.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: ...your answers. So understanding that there's not a fiscal impact, if that's...if that's the case then, the issue really is, I believe, what Senator Landis mentioned, in the philosophical switch that is occurring that could have some long-term ramifications. I was originally interested in this exact issue, and went to Senator Landis, and he talked me out of being supportive of this because of the impact that it could have in changing the whole purpose of what CHIP was created for originally. And as I've been told, CHIP was, in fact, brought about as a last resort when you could not find anything else. And this is a deviation of that. It may be a small one, and it may be one that is justified. And it's very difficult, as we all know, to vote against children, but I think we want to pause for just a second and think about the philosophical change that's occurring here and whether or not there'll be fortitude down the road to maintain the purpose of why CHIP was originally brought about. So I raise caution from that perspective. Some general comments: I...the whole reason for CHIP and the cost of health insurance, the benefits that are provided is one that's very difficult for this country and this state and us to get our hands around. It's a very difficult...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: ...difficult issue. But one of the...one of the concerns has always been availability and availability has been a far more important issue than affordability when you've had to make the choice if you look at the policy decisions that have been made. And Senator Wesely brought out a very good point when he said, golly sakes, when you add in what the employer has been paying for the employee, gosh, this becomes unaffordable. Let's remember that the next time we look at expanding the cost to employers, employer plans, by adding benefits because, in essence, what we're doing is driving up those costs that ultimately affect all of us. Thank you.
