Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR BROMM: Mr. Speaker, I have indicated what the purpose and objective of the amendment was. I don't think I need to elaborate any more, if there are no questions, so I'd simply ask for the adoption.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Bromm amendment to LB 924. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, on adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The amendment is adopted. Before we move to the next item, a guest of all of us this morning, in the north balcony, are the Nebraska Farm Bureau Citizenship Safety Seminar. There are 100 sophomores and juniors from across the state. This is the 25th anniversary of the event, and it is an annual event. Would you all please stand and be recognized by your Legislature. Thank you for being with us. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment by Senator Hillman, AM3986, but I have a note. Senator, you'd like to withdraw and substitute AM4010 for that amendment.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Any objection? Substitution is ordered.

CLERK: (AM)4010, Senator.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Hillman, you're recognized to open.
